GUILD RULES.

I.—That the Society be called the SWANSEA AND BRECON DIOCESAN GUILD OF BELL-RINGERS, and that its objects are (1) to recognise the true position of Ringers as Church Officers; (2) to cultivate the art of Change-Ringing; and (3) to promote due order in the Belfry.

II.—That the Government of the Guild shall be vested in a Committee consisting of the President and Vice-Presidents, together with the following Members, who shall be elected annually at a General Meeting, viz., a Master (who shall be a Change-Ringer), a Ringing Master, a Secretary, a Treasurer, Honorary Members, Change-ringing Members, District Secretaries and Ringing Masters—*ex-officio*. Five to form a quorum.

III.—That the Guild shall consist of three classes—Honorary, Change-Ringing, and Probationary Members.

IV.—That Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or shall become Life Members by a donation of not less than two guineas; Change-Ringing Members and Probationary Members shall pay 1/6 annually. All subscriptions to become due on January 1st of each year.

V.—That Probationers shall have no power to vote or take part in the business meetings of the Guild. If they do not become duly qualified members in the course of two years, they shall cease to be members of the Guild.

VI.—That the name of any member whose subscription or payment for the year has not been paid, will be printed in Italics in the Annual Report, and if it is unpaid for another year, the name will be omitted.

VII.—That no one shall be admitted a Change-Ringing Member till he can take part in 120 changes on a ring of Church-bells or Hand-bells.

VIII.—That in any Belfry where there are not fewer than five Change-Ringing Members, two Tenor men may be allowed to join the Guild as Change-Ringing Members, without qualifying according to Rule 7.

IX.—That Candidates, being Members of the Church of England, whose qualifications have been vouched for according to the Guild's form, shall be admitted Change-Ringing Members by the Secretary, who shall report the same to the next Committee or General Meeting for confirmation. Any Member of a Church Belfry may be admitted as a Probationary Member on the recommendation of the Parochial Clergyman.

X.—That Ringers residing out of the Diocese may be provisionally elected before attempting a peal, by a majority of the Members of the Guild then present; provided that the Proposer or Seconder of such person forward to the Secretary the required voucher, and the annual subscription for an Extra-Diocesan Member of 1/6 or a life composition of 5/-.

XI.—That should a Ringer residing in the Diocese, not being a Member of the Guild, wish to take part in a Guild's Peal, he may be elected by a majority of the Members then present; his Membership to be subject to confirmation at the next Committee Meeting, and to the payment of the Annual Subscription of 1/6, which sum shall be collected by the senior member of the Guild then present.

XII.—That a Certificate of Membership shall be presented to every Change-Ringing Member of the Guild, which Certificate shall be returned in the event of his dismissal.

XIII.—That the Annual Meeting shall be held in June, July, or August, for the purpose of electing Officers, and for united practice in Change-Ringing, the time and place to be fixed by the Committee, and arrangements made for a Special Service in one of the Churches.

XIV.—That any Belfry in Union may frame its own Regulations, provided they do not militate with the Rules of the Guild.

XV.—That each Belfry in Union shall be provided with a Certificate of Union, on which shall be printed a form of prayer, which should be said by one of the Members before starting to ring.

XVI.—That the Guild's chief object being the greater reverence of God's House and Worship, any Member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Committee, who shall report the same to the next Annual Meeting, and in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payments that he may have made to the Guild.

XVII.—That no alteration in, or addition to, the above Rules shall be made, except at an Annual or Special Meeting, and notice of such proposed addition or alteration must be sent in writing to the Secretary a month before the Meeting.

XVIII.—That two-thirds of the balance in the hands of Districts at the end of a year, after paying all expenses, etc, but excluding the balance in hand at the commencement of the year, be transferred to the General Fund of the Guild. (Passed at Annual Meeting, 20th July, 1929).

THE REPORT.

ON the 28th October, 1923, the Lord Bishop of the Diocese presided over a meeting of Ringers which he had convened for the purpose of forming a Guild of Bell-Ringers for the Diocese. It was the unanimous decision of the meeting that the Guild be duly formed, and several Officers were then appointed, together with a representative Committee, and these were requested to set about their task forthwith.

Circular letters were addressed to 136 Clergy in charge of the Parishes in the Diocese, and of this total it is interesting to note that 17 only failed to reply. The circular asked for certain information concerning the number and state of the bells in their Church Towers, and from the replies received the following information was gathered :—

The bells were not in ringing order in several of the above Towers, and a representative of Messrs. John Taylor, Bell Founders, Loughborough, inspected, during the week commencing 16th June, 1924, and duly reported upon the Towers at Llangasty, Llangorse, Llandefalle, Llanafanfawr, Gladestry, St. John's, Morriston, and St. John's, Cefn Coed.

The bells of the Cathedral Church of St. John, Brecon, were also inspected, and an estimate of the cost of a peal of 10 bells was duly forwarded.

West Wales Association.—On the 1st December, 1923, the Lord Bishop (who was accompanied by the ex-Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer) attended a meeting of the Association at the Vestry of St. Mary's Church, Swansea. It was proposed to disband the Association, and information was desired as to the formation of a District of the Guild in the Swansea District. The Lord Bishop addressed the meeting, and it was intimated that the Guild would in all probability have the support of the Towers in the Association Area when disbandment took place. The result of the meeting is that ringers from the following Towers (which are situate outside the boundaries of the Diocese) are now affiliated to the Guild:—

Ringing Competition.—At the first Annual Meeting of the Guild, held at Brecon on the 5th July, 1924, it was unanimously decided that a Shield be procured and put up for competition annually in order to improve and encourage bell-ringing in the Guild. The late Dr. T. Price Thomas, Brecon, was approached, and he generously presented a Shield in commemoration of Empire Day, the Competition to take place on the nearest Saturday to Empire Day. Various Associations and Guilds were communicated with regarding Rules for such a competition, and the following Rules were adopted:—

1. That all members of the Guild be eligible to take part in the Competition, provided that their Annual Subscriptions are paid, and also subject to an Entrance Fee of 1/- per member; such entrance fee to be paid to the Hon. Treasurer before any Band takes part in the Contest.

2. That no member be allowed to ring with more than one Band, and no stationed ringer be allowed to ring with any other Band if his own Band requires him.
3. That the Shield never becomes the absolute property of any Band.
4. Every Band intending to take part in contest must send in the names of the complete set to the Hon. Secretary seven days before date of contest.
5. That a Band coming a man short to the contest may select an unstationed member, not taking part in the contest, to make them up—providing they receive the consent of the Committee on the day of contest.
6. No member or members shall be allowed to ring in any Tower selected for a contest, previous to the contest taking place; any infringement shall disqualify such member or members from taking part in the contest.
7. The Test Piece to be rung at the contest is:—
 - (a) Raising the bells in peal, then stand. Adjust ropes if necessary.
 - (b) 120 changes of Doubles (any method), then stand.
 - (c) Falling the bells in peal.
 - (d) Time limit—20 minutes.

N.B.—Since the above rules were framed, it has been the practice to handicap the home team nine points, but all teams may earn five points for ringing a method other than Grandsire Doubles. The last-mentioned points are given in order to encourage teams to ring higher-grade methods.

Adjudicator.—The Guild has been fortunate in securing the services of Mr. W. H. Fussell, Slough, Bucks., as Adjudicator at each of the Ringing Competitions, and he has carried out his duties in a highly satisfactory manner. Our warmest thanks are due to Mr. Fussell for services rendered.

Grandsire, Stedman, Bob Minor, and Kent Treble Bob were rung at this competition.

Cards are presented to the first three teams. Mr. Fussell's practice has been to allocate a maximum of 240 points for the Test Piece, i.e., 60 each for Raising and Falling, and 120 points for the Change-ringing.

At each of the Parishes visited, all Officials of the Guild, Members, and some friends, have been royally entertained to a Cold Luncheon and Tea free of charge. The members' appreciation of these was shown at each meeting.

Membership Cards.—Mr. W. H. Fussell was good enough to offer to prepare and submit to the Guild designs for a Membership Card. These designs were duly received, and the selected Card is one well worthy of its purpose. Our heartiest thanks are due to Mr. Fussell for all the assistance he has rendered the Guild since its inception.

Peal Records.—Mr. James P. Hyett (Glasbury) deserves our warmest thanks for compiling the Peal Records inserted in this report.

Proposed Formation of a New District.—At the 1931 Annual Meeting, the Hon. Secretary reported that he had been in communication with several persons regarding the formation of a New District, but the response was poor. The Dean of St. David's stated that the Lord Bishop of St. David's approved

of the suggestion, but objected to the name proposed, viz., "The St. David's District of the Swansea and Brecon Diocesan Guild of Bell-Ringers." This is a minor matter which can be amicably arranged at a later date. It is suggested that Members of the Guild whose Towers are in close proximity to the new area should approach the ringers concerned and endeavour to get them to become members of the Guild and their Towers duly affiliated.

Donations.—It is desired to place on record that when the Guild was formed the Ringers of St. Mary's Church, Brecon, sent a donation of £1, and Mr. William Evans, Ship Street, Brecon, was also good enough to subscribe 5/-.

Washbrook Memorial Fund.—A subscription of £1 15s. 9d. (10/- from the Guild Funds, and £1 5s. 9d. Collection taken at Annual Meeting 1925), was sent to the Treasurer of this Fund.

Fabian Stedman's Tercentenary Fund.—A donation of £2 2s. 0d. has also been made to this Fund.



GENERAL FUND.


