

## GUILD RULES.

I.—That the Society be called the SWANSEA AND BRECON DIOCESAN GUILD OF BELL-RINGERS, and that its objects are (1) to recognise the true position of Ringers as Church Officers; (2) to cultivate the art of Change-Ringing; and (3) to promote due order in the Belfry.

II.—That the Government of the Guild shall be vested in a Committee consisting of the President and Vice-Presidents, together with the following Members, who shall be elected annually at a General Meeting, viz., a Master (who shall be a Change-Ringer), a Ringing Master, a Secretary, a Treasurer, Honorary Members, Change-ringing Members, District Secretaries and Ringing Masters—*ex-officio*. Five to form a quorum

III.—That the Guild shall consist of three classes—Honorary, Change-Ringing, and Probationary Members.

IV.—That Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5/- annually, or shall become Life Members by a donation of not less than two guineas; Change-Ringing Members and Probationary Members shall pay 1/6 annually. All subscriptions to become due on January 1st of each year.

V.—That the name of any member whose subscription or payment for the year has not been paid, will be printed in Italics in the Annual Report, and if it is unpaid for another year, the name will be omitted.

VI.—That no one shall be admitted a Change-Ringing Member till he can take part in 120 changes on a ring of Church-bells or Hand-bells.

VII.—That in any Belfry where there are not fewer than five Change-Ringing Members, two Tenor men may be allowed to join the Guild as Change-Ringing Members, without qualifying according to Rule 6.

VIII.—That Candidates, being Members of the Church of England, whose qualifications have been vouched for according to the Guild's form, shall be admitted Change-Ringing Members by the Secretary, who shall report the same to the next Committee or General Meeting for confirmation. Any Member of a Church Belfry may be admitted as a Probationary Member on the recommendation of the Parochial Clergyman.

IX.—That Ringers residing out of the Diocese may be provisionally elected before attempting a peal, by a majority of the Members of the Guild then present; provided that the Proposer or Seconder of such person forward to the Secretary the required voucher, and the annual subscription for an Extra-Diocesan Member of 1/6 or a life composition of 5/-

X.—That should a Ringer residing in the Diocese, not being a Member of the Guild, wish to take part in a Guild's Peal, he may be elected by a majority of the Members then present; his Membership to be subject to confirmation at the next Committee Meeting, and to the payment of the Annual Subscription of 1/6, which sum shall be collected by the senior member of the Guild then present.

XI.—That a Certificate of Membership shall be presented to every Change-Ringing Member of the Guild, which Certificate shall be returned in the event of his dismissal.

XII.—That the Annual Meeting shall be held in June, July or August, for the purpose of electing Officers, and for united practice in Change-Ringing, the time and place to be fixed by the Committee, and arrangements made for a Special Service in one of the Churches.

XIII.—That any Belfry in Union may frame its own Regulations, provided they do not militate with the Rules of the Guild.

XIV.—That each Belfry in Union shall be provided with a Certificate of Union, on which shall be printed a form of prayer, which should be said by one of the Members before starting to ring.

XV.—That the Guild's chief object being the greater reverence of God's House and Worship, any Member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Committee, who shall report the same to the next Annual Meeting, and in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payments that he may have made to the Guild.

XVI.—That no alteration in, or addition to, the above Rules shall be made, except at an Annual or Special Meeting, and notice of such proposed addition or alteration must be sent in writing to the Secretary a month before the Meeting.

XVII.—That two-thirds of the balance in the hands of Districts at the end of a year, after paying all expenses, etc., but excluding the balance in hand at the commencement of the year, be transferred to the General Fund of the Guild. (Passed at Annual Meeting, 20th July, 1929).

## REPORT.

At the Annual Meeting held at Ely Towers, Brecon, on 23rd July, 1938, it was the unanimous decision of the meeting that a report, covering the period 1st July, 1932, to the 30th June, 1938, should be published.

During this period, the Guild has lost, through death, a number of its founder-members. Our first duty is to record the death of our first President and first Bishop of Swansea and Brecon, who passed away at Weymouth on February 2nd, 1934.

It was under his Lordship's leadership that the Guild started on its way, and it was largely due to his hearty sympathy that the Guild has grown to its present strength. His Lordship was a happy host, and what was more, a good counsellor and friend.

The Guild also lost a friend on the death of the late Archdeacon of Llandaff, who, as Vicar of Cadoxton, was always ready to welcome the Guild to his parish.

of the members of that Tower who were ringers during his stay at Gorseinon.

We wish to congratulate one of our members, Rev. W. Cynwyd C. Williams, who was ordained at Brecon Cathedral on 7th March, 1936.

At the Annual Meeting held on June 23rd, 1938, Mr. Leo T. Havard, Hon. Sec. of the Guild for the past 6 years, tendered his resignation, this was accepted with regret and Mr. Havard warmly thanked for his past services so faithfully rendered.

### RULES GOVERNING RINGING COMPETITIONS.

1. That all members of the Guild be eligible to take part in competitions, provided that their annual subscriptions are paid, and also subject to entrance fee of 1/- per member, such entrance fee to be paid to the Hon. Treasurer before any Band takes part in contest.

2. That no member be allowed to ring with more than one Band, and no stationed ringer be allowed to ring with any Band if his own Band requires him/her.

3. That the shield never becomes the absolute property of any Band.

4. Every Band intending to take part in contest must send in the names of the complete set to the Hon. Secretary seven (7) days before the date of the contest.

5. That a Band attending at the contest without the required number may select an unstationed member not taking part in the contest, providing they receive the consent of the Committee on the day of the contest.

6. No member or members shall be allowed to ring in any Tower selected for a contest previous to the contest taking place; any infringement shall disqualify such member or members from taking part in the contest.

7. The test piece to be rung at the contest is:—

- (a) Raising the bells in peal, then stand: adjust ropes if necessary;
- (b) 120 changes of any method, or four thirties;
- (c) Falling the bells in peal;
- (d) Time limit—20 minutes.

8. The home team handicap is 5 points, but teams ringing Stedman Doubles and all minor methods be awarded 5 points. (Rule 8 was amended on the 27th June, 1936).

**Adjudicator.** The Guild has been fortunate in securing the services of Mr. W. H. Fussell as Adjudicator from 1925 to 1938. It was with regret that the members of the 1938 competition learned from Mr. Fussell that he would be unable to adjudicate again. He

was cordially thanked for his services to the Guild.

The Committee decided at the Committee Meeting at Ely Towers, following the Annual Meeting, that Mr. Pitman be approached to adjudicate the 1939 competition. Mr. Pitman consented to adjudicate, and in reply, thanked the Committee and members for their confidence in him.
